**MINUTES OF THE 12TH ALL INDIA CONFERENCE OF MINISTERIAL
STAFF ASSOCIATION, SURVEY OF INDIA HELD ON KOLKATA ON 10TH,
11TH & 12TH January 2012.**

The All India Conference of Ministerial Staff Association commenced on 10th January, 2012 at Kolkata the Trade Union City. All the delegates from various stations assembled at 10:00 A:M for procession from 13, Wood Street Gate to 15, Wood Street, the venue of conference, raising various slogans. All leaders CHQs were thereafter requested to take their seats of the Dias. Com. T.D. Banerjee, Member. Departmental Council (JCM) inaugurated the A.I.C. and pointed out the role of the Government to implement the anti-employees policies as far as concern of the Central Govt. employees & Workers and described a detailed and objective picture of the overall situation and reasonably hoped that this A.I.C. As proposed by Com. D.C.R. Karki, Organising Secretary General (CHQs) and seconded by the House, the steering Committee of the Presidium to conduct the businesses of the meeting was formed with Com. T.D. Banerjee, Member, Departmental Council (JCM), Com. Sujit Sinha, President, (CHQs) and Com. Sanjay Kumar, V.P. (CHQs). After that Secretary General submitted his report before the Delegates. In the report Com. Manoj Kumar Sharma gave an account of the latest scenario covering National situation, Central Government Employees & Worker's Movement and Survey of India's situation including latest position on Ministerial issues in a nutshell. He also appreciated the Kolkata Branch to convene this prestigious meeting within a short period of time and limited resources.

All CHQs office bearers viz. Com. Sujit Sinha, Com. Juliana R. Vincent, Com. Sanjay Kumar, Com. R.N. Rath, Com. R. Dutta & Com. Balraj Sahni delivered their short but delightful speeches, covering the overall functioning of the CHQs. **Thereafter messages received from the other Sister Organizations were read out. In these messages all had given their best wishes for the success of this AIC.**

Further, on the directives from the Presidium, the Hony. Secretary/Representatives of all the Branches attending the AIC, delivered their short speeches, covering all related aspects i.e. Branch activities and objective evaluation on CHQs functioning. All the speakers, on behalf of their respective branches, assured CHQs for full all time co-operation in future, also.

Points received from various Branches and submitted to CHQs were then thoroughly discussed. Finally the following decisions were arrived at:-

1- Immediate implementation of Cadre Restructuring in respect of Ministerial Staff as assured/informed by the DST vide letter No. SM/11/01/2008 dated 3rd June, 2008 received under SG's letter No. J- 7253/612-MSA dated 3rd June,2008.

After the detailed discussion on the issue by the COBs and attending branches and drawing conclusion by the Member DC (JCM), it was unanimously decided that a suitably strong resolution will be adopted for submission to the Ministry/SG and all other concerned. (The Same was passed and sent through FAX to Ministry/SG and all concern).

2-Grant of Higher Grade Pay to the E&AO & OS keeping in mind the fact that the post of Asstt. & OS cannot merged due to the functional requirement in the Department.

&

3-Grant of Higher Grade Pay to the UDCs.

The matters in question has already been taken up by the association with the higher authorities. In the light of the detailed discussion in the AIC, it is decided that the matter will be vigorously persued with the Govt. by taking help of the National Council (JCM) with a particular reference to the resolution already passed by the Kolkata Branch MSA.

4- Holding of DPC for all Ministerial Promotional post.

&

6-Filling up of all vacant post of LDCs/UDC/Asstt./OSs/E&AOs/ Hindi Translators/Assistant Director for smooth functioning

Efforts are already being taken to ensure completion of all DPCs in time and filling up of vacant post for smooth functioning in all the GDCs/offices.

5-Declaration of unfix establishment of UDCs and Assistants in the GDCs.

It was decided that the matter will be duly taken up with the higher authorities.

7-Immediate withdrawal of Technical Officers from Ministerial/Administrative/Account Jobs.

After detailed discussion it is decided that a suitable paragraph is to be included in the Resolution No (1) to be adopted. (The Resolution was passed and sent through FAX to all concern).

8- Immediate settlement of all pending repatriation cases.

A considerable number of cases are already been settled during last few months and no such Repatriation cases are pending at present.

**9- Holding of LDCE from LDC to UDC well in time
&
13- Increasing Grade Pay of LDC & UDC.**

In the light of OM, regarding enhancement of Grade Pay of UDC's in CSCS Cadre passed by Ministry, a long discussion to extend the same benefit to sub ordinate department also were made before the house. However, it was decided that CHQs will explore all possibilities to take action for this justified demand of the staff in continuation of the earlier correspondences with Confederation HQs. Every efforts will be made by the CHQs for holding of LCE in time.

10-Construction of Office Building and Residential accommodation in all the stations.

The matters was already taken up with the authorities and it will be again pursued touching previous references. There should be collective efforts of all organization, so that all possibilities will explore for the same.

11- Immediate settlement of all disciplinary cases.

As and when any matter by any Branch is brought into the notice of the CHQs, the CHQs takes immediate possible care to settle it in the interest of members.

12- Arrangement of common computerized programme for accounts work.

The matter discussed and it was decided that the Branch will discuss matter with concerned Addl.S.G./Director for providing software for pay bill etc from the market.

14- Nomenclature to LDC, UDC & Assistant must be changed.

After a long discussion and in view of the DOPT's orders in this regard, which is crystal clear, it has been decided to drop this point at present.

15-Independent computer and printer should be provided to all Ministerial Staff (Adm./Accounts work)

The concerned Branch will discuss the problem with Local Administration.

16-Grant of Honorarium (Cashier & Assistant Cashier)

It was decided to request SG to grant honorarium to the employees doing cash work and assisting the Cashier.

17- Promotion of OS

The S.G. will again approached for adjustment of Assistant to the post of O.S. on promotion in the same station as far as possible and feasible. The matter for grant of 3% of increment in the same grade pay will again be taken up with the Confederation HQ.

18- Deployment of Ministerial Staff for Estate/legal/Stenographer duties.

It was decided that this matter would also be taken up with the Surveyor General.

19- All promotional/MACP orders should be circulated to all office/branches.

CHQs will suitably take up this matter with SG so that promotion orders in r/o Ministerial Staff could be circulated to all GDCs as and when these orders issued. However as interim measures CHQs will provide such type of promotion orders to all branches.

20- Merging of wings with the GDC's existing in the same station

The matter will be taken up with SG as far as possible and feasible.

21- Next station of AIC/CEC

Bhubaneswar and Bangalore Branch propose their station for the next meeting It will be kept in mind while holding of any AIC/CEC.

22- Increased of Monthly subscription Rs.20/-pm

Since MSA is having sufficient funds in its account, no enhancement in the existing subscription is necessary, Secretary General has also expressed his view that there is no need for this increase.

23- Grant-in-aid

The proposal in respect of grant-in-aid has already being taken up with SG/DST.

24- Increased sanction strength of Ministerial Staff according to sanctioned strength of office.

It was decided that CHQs will pursue the case regarding allotment of DDO Code and additional strength in all the GDCs as far as possible as per the Govt. of India norms.

25- Compulsory training of 110 course for LDC.

It was unanimously decided that the names of willing candidates for training at Hyderabad/Delhi should not be denied. In this regard necessary correspondence/discussions will be done by CHQs. It was disapproved by the house that training should be compulsory, as it will give a weapon in the hands of Administration for harassment.

26- Discussion and progress of points raised during delegates session in the shape of agenda-items during last CEC.

The secretary General appraised the house regarding progress over points raised during last CEC and the house satisfied on the efforts put on by the CHQs. in these matters.

27- Grant of MACP after completion of 8/16/24 years of qualifying service.

The 6th CPC introduced the new MACP scheme after completion of 10,20 & 30 years of service. Demanding of this after completion of 8,16 & 24 Years services is not at all possible.

28- Job classification as done and circulated by SG during 2011 is not satisfactory.

No such official job classification issued by the Surveyor General of India. As and when job classification is issued, the CHQs will take suitable action in this regard.

29- Revision rules/rate of OTA.

This item comes under the purview of the National Council (JCM) matter as already been brought to the notice of National Council members so many times.

30- Local administration is not in good condition.

All matters related to the local administration, should always be tried to settled down by branch at first. If not sorted out, it should be immediately sent to the notice of CHQs with references.

On the second day of the AIC i.e. on 11-01-2012 during the course of discussion Com. Pijush Roy, General Secretary of the Co-ordination committee of C.G.Es' & Ws' Unions and Associations, West Bengal delivered his fascinating speech and presented the latest scenario covering the whole National situation economic crisis and so many other problem with regards to the Central Govt. Employees.

On 12-01-2012, the concluding day of the A.I.C. the discussions on the points received from various Branches was over and the Secretary General's Report / Audited accounts of the CHQs were unanimously passed by the house. The house again unanimously decided that the last para of Secretary General's Report, in which Secretary General had requested the House to relieve him from the CHQs, responsibilities, should be dropped. However on the suggestions from the various quarters, the request made by the Secretary General was dropped.

Com. T.D. Banerjee, Member, Departmental Council (JCM) stressed upon the needs for strengthening hands of Association, in order to help build massive movement against the various anti-employees and anti-people policies of the Govt. Com. Banerjee also gave some of his ideas over the menace of awful downsizing policies of the Govt. in various Officers/Departments.

Com. (Smt) Juliana R. Vincent, Jt. Secretary General, M.S.A. (CHQs), spoke in detail, over the Neo-Liberal Economic policies of the Union Govt. and their adverse effects on the common people in general and the working class in particular. She also stressed upon the crying need for the United Movement of Working Class throughout the Country.

Four Resolutions as decided during the discussion on various points was passed by the house.

Finally, the election commission for the election of the Central Office Bearers and JCM member was formed and the following Central Office Bearers and JCM member were elected to struggle again for the betterment of Ministerial Staff Association and its members :-

Formation of the Ad hoc Committee of CoC, Uttarakhand, Dehradun

In the meeting of the representatives of all Central Government Employees Associations / Unions, Dehradun, convened at the Community Centre, Survey of India on 7-2-2012, which was addressed by Com. S.K. Vyas, President, Confederation of Central Govt. Employees & Workers, New Delhi, Com. M. S. Raja, Secretary General, AIA&AA & Member National Council (JCM) and Com. Giriraj Singh, Secretary General, RMSEA & Member, National Council (JCM) over participation of the Central Govt. Employees in the All India Strike of 28-2-2012. In the said meeting, it was also urged by the above Comrades to form a CoC at Dehradun and in the interregnum, the Ad hoc Committee of the CoC, Dehradun may be constituted.

2. In pursuance to the aforesaid suggestions of the Confederation leaders and at the behest of the joint call given by Com. Vrigu Bhattacharjee, Assistant Secretary General, Confederation of the Central Government Employees & Workers, New Delhi and Com. Pijush Roy, Organizing Secretary, Confederation of the Central Govt. Employees & Workers, New Delhi, who came to Dehradun to participate the AIC of Botanical Survey of India Employees Association (BSIEA), a meeting of the representatives of all Central Government Employees Associations / Unions located at Dehradun was convened by Com. Manoj Kumar Sharma, Convenor, CoC, Survey of India Associations / Union and Secretary General, Ministerial Staff Association, Survey of India, in the premises of the Botanical Survey of India on 10-4-2012 *inter alia* to discuss over the formation of the Ad hoc Committee of the Coordination Committee of the Central Government Employees Associations / Unions comprising of the State of Uttarakhand (in short CoC, Dehradun). Com. Arup Chatterjee, Secretary General, BSIEA hosted the aforesaid meeting.

3. At the outset, Com. Manoj Kumar Sharma, Convenor of the meeting welcomed all the participants of the meeting. He then gave a brief introduction of the purpose of this meeting. He stressed the need for formation of the CoC at Dehradun. He requested to Senior Comrade S.P. Ringola to preside over the meeting. Com. Vrigu Bhattacharjee, Assistant Secretary General, Confederation placed a brief report on the progress and position of the pending issues of the Central Govt. Employees and stressed to strengthen the organizational set up of the CGE at the grass root level. Com. Pijush Roy, Organizing Secretary, Confederation and General Secretary, CGE&W, West Bengal, Kolkata pressed for forming an Ad hoc Committee of the CoC at Dehradun. Com. Arup Chatterjee, Secretary General, BSIEA, Com. B. Patro, Joint Convenor, SOI

Associations / Union, Com. Deepak Karki, Organizing Secretary, MSA, Com.K.P. Maithani, Secretary General, TSA, Com. Kulwant. Singh, General Secretary, Group 'B' Officers Association, Com. S.P. Thapa, Civil Accounts Association, Com. B.C. Dhyani, AIA&AA, Com. Jagmohan Singh Bisht, Association of Forest Education, Manjeet Singh Pal, Survey of India expressed their views on the occasion and stressed the need for forming a CoC at Dehradun.

4. The Ad hoc Committee of CoC, Uttarakhand, Dehradun was unanimously constituted comprising the following office bearers. The meeting decided that the Ad hoc Committee will mobilize all the Central Govt. Employees Associations / Union at Dehradun and shall make necessary arrangement for framing of the Interim Constitution/Bye-Laws of the CoC and shall pave way for conduct of the election of the full-fledged Committee of CoC within a period of 6 months:-

1. **Com. B.C. Dhyani**, AIA&AA, Uttarakhand, Dehradun (Mob.9997333464) - **Chariman.**
