Discussions on the points

**Point No. 1. Immediate completion of pending processes of Cadre Restructuring :  
Points raised by CHQ, Dehra Dun, Ranchi, Hyderabad, Bangalore, Patna, Trivandrum  
and other Branches.**

Delegates from different branches discussed about this point in detail.

Secretary General explained the latest development in this matter and proposed whatever the CEC decide we will go accordingly.

Com. T.D. Banerjee explained the details of the latest/Final Cadre restructuring proposal which was forwarded to Ministry by S.G. He told the proposal is good for Ministerial Staff. The only drawback in the latest proposal sent by S.G. is the deduction of 35 posts of Assistants i.e., from 286 to 251 which is highly objectionable. He told in this respect that, a resolution should be adopted and we should give 2 months time to settle the issues of Restructuring.

After a very lengthy discussion, considering the anger and emotions of the members on this matter, it is decided to pass a resolution for immediate implementation of Cadre Restructuring at the earliest (within 2 months). Simultaneously we may ask the permission from S.G. to have an interview with the Under Secretary, Ministry of Science & Technology by 5 of the Central Office Bearers of MSA. If we are getting a positive reply we will give some more time to settle the issue. If the progress is very slow or negative, it is decided to take legal opinion on this matter from Kolkata and Hyderabad Branch and if the opinion is positive we will move to CAT.

The meeting on 1st day was over at 9.45 pm followed by delicious dinner.

POINTS DISCUSSED ON 2<sup>ND</sup> JUNE, 2016

**Point No. 2. Completion of pending DPC & release of promotion orders.

**Point No. 5. Amendment of recruitment rules of Ministerial Cadre.**

Member Departmental Council, JCM will write a suitable letter to National Council in this regard.

**Point No. 6. Change of Nomenclatures of Ministerial Cadres.**

**Points raised by CHQ and other branches.**

This matter was already taken up with S.G. A reminder will be issued by CHQ.



**Point No. 7. Filling of all vacant post of E&AO/OS/Assistant/UDC/LDC/Hindi Translator/ ADOL & Points raised by CHQ and other branches.**

**Point No. 8. Promotion upto Assistant/O.S. should be delinked with transfer. Points raised by Ranchi/Hyderabad/Patna Branches.**  
It is a point of unfixed establishment upto Assistant. Will take up this issue in JCM.

**Point No. 9. Provide a copy of approved Bye-Laws of MSA to all Branch Points raised by Ranchi Branch**  
It is decided to give a copy to all the branches.

**Point No. 10. Common Computerized programme for accounts/administrative staff Points raised by Ranchi/Kolkata and other branches.**  
CHQ will write a suitable letter to S.G. for introduction of Common Computerized Programme for accounts work.

**Point No. 11. AEBAS system implemented in Kolkata in biased manner. Points raised by Kolkata Branch**  
It is decided that Kolkata Branch will take up the case under intimation to CHQ.

**Point No. 12. All AMA Bill/Hospital bills are withheld by Director, WB GDC, Kolkata without any reason causing lot of desolation amongst staff in respect of the claims of self and family Points raised by Kolkata Branch**

Kolkata branch will take initiative to pass a joint resolution by all Associations/Union of Kolkata branch with copy to their respective CHQs.
